It is no less true for me as well. I have always said as I come into a new transitional ministry I love this work, but I hate the goodbyes.

This is especially true at Aberdeen First Presbyterian Church. I love the ministry we have done together. I love the relationships I have gained. I have grown attached to the way we function and live as the body of Christ together. It is extremely hard to walk away and give you folks and your service to a new leader, shepherd, pastor.

Still, when I arrived, I was clear that this is part of my job. This is part of the call to transitional work I have made throughout my many churches of ministry. This is what God has called me to do.

Many people have asked about my next steps. Where am I going from here? The simple answer today is I have no idea. I don't know where God is going to send me.

I am exploring a few options at this moment. They

are all in the infancy stage. However, the one thing I know about transitional ministry is that things may happen very quickly. As it takes a while to find the new called pastor to a church. it may take very little time to engage a transitional pastor once the dialogue is



begun. Part of this is because it is done by the session and not by the whole church which is true expediently. However, the main reason is that it is a temporary position from the start. I start, knowing that my work includes a short-lived hello. The goodbye is always right around the corner.

Something else I know about departing our church is that it always comes too fast. It seems that the moment I arrive, the next moment follows that it is

Still there are two things about my departure I hope to accomplish.

Just as there were many things, we needed to do to find the new pastor so too there are a couple of things I pray we will be able to do well as we transition between myself and Pastor Chuck.





Floyd Plemmons (PNC member & Elder) signed Pastor Chuck's Terms of Call during the Congregational Meeting on February 13, 2022.
