Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

During this period of transition, the Stewardship Commission has been hard at work managing your gifts. Thank you for your ongoing financial support that makes it possible to continue Christ's ministry here on the Harbor.

This year we have assisted the session with forecasting our financial ability to call a new full-time pastor, and we feel that we are on stable financial footing to do that. We are also planning on how to make additional funds available for recruitment and for moving expenses for a new pastor.

With online worship our online giving has increased. Our online giving account was once idle with just a little money over many years. Now, however, each month there are gifts that come in through our website and the linked pay-pal account. This is a convenient way for those who may be separated physically to make a gift. If you are having difficulty remembering to make a gift, we would like to invite you to consider setting up giving through your bank's online banking feature. You can set this up to make gifts routinely, or with a few clicks on demand. Please query your bank on how to set this up or contact the office if you have any questions.

We are planning the budget for 2022, and pledge forms went out in mid-November. Please make a pledge to help us accurately forecast our church's financial situation for 2022 and return the form to the church office as soon as possible. We cannot emphasize enough how important this is; in the absence of a pledge, we are forced to guess about giving which causes uncertainty in our financial planning. We would like to have this information by mid-December to make it possible to finalize the 2022 budget.

Finally, we would like to make a plea for additional gifts in 2021. We are currently suffering an approximate \$25,000 budget deficit. Decreased pandemic attendance, increased insurance premiums, the loss of Raindrop Preschool revenue, and other factors have all contributed to our current situation. If you have the ability to make an additional gift prior to the end of the year it would be greatly appreciated.

We feel very blessed, and we would like to thank you for your fellowship and continued support of Aberdeen First Presbyterian Church.
